SAJA3 (1958 Tivoli Jazz Concert) and Memphis — \$25.00

- SAJA 1 Bill Munro — ‘A retrospective 1946-1977’ Volume 1**
A wonderful mixture of tracks from the Southern Jazz Group, Maurice Le Doeuff Sextet, Bill Munro Jazz Six, the Campus Six and Dave Dallwitz groups featuring the wonderful trumpet playing of Bill Munro. Many tracks have never before been issued.
- SAJA 2 Bill Munro — ‘A retrospective 1977-2000’ Volume 2**
Contains many unissued performances recorded by Bill Munro with Dave Dallwitz groups, the Climax Jazz Band, Golden Gate Jazz Orchestra and Bruce Gray.
- SAJA 3 Johnny Malpas ‘That Rhythm Man’**
Traces the recorded career of banjo and guitar player Johnny Malpas from his days with the Southern Jazz Group. Johnny is heard with Unity Jazz Band, Dave Dallwitz groups, Jazz Jesters, Golden Gate Jazz Orchestra and others.
- SAJA 4 1958 Tivoli Jazz Concert with Bob Barnard**
This historic concert was organised by the Adelaide Jazz Society and featured Bob Barnard with the Black Eagle Jazz Band and an all star group of top Adelaide musicians. The CD also contains tracks by the Bill Munro Jazz Six, Bruce Gray’s All Stars, Anne van der Harst Quartet and the University Jazz Band.
- SAJA 5 Early South Australian Jazz — the late 30s and early 40s**
A unique collection of early South Australian Jazz. The jazz historian will delight in tracks from the 5KA Swing Club Band, Maurie Le Doeuff’s Swing Sextet, Malcolm Bills groups, the Southern Jazz Group and the Dave Jenkins Big Band. None of these recordings have ever been released commercially.
- SAJA 6 Maurie LeDoeuff —** this CD presents a selection of tracks featuring Maurie LeDoeuff, one of Australia’s most influential jazz musicians. These cover his career, featuring a number of styles of jazz, and include three tracks recorded with the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra.
- CAJ 1** The SA Jazz Archive’s first contemporary release:
Ellington’s Heirs — produced by Ron Spain and featuring the cream of Adelaide’s younger jazz players, performing the music of Duke Ellington.
- MEMPHIS RECORDS – The Southern Jazz Group and Friends**
Classic Australian Jazz from the 1940s, featuring Dave Dallwitz, Bruce Gray, Bill Munro, Bob Wright, Errol Buddle, John Malpas. Contains the earliest surviving record of the Southern Jazz Group and the earliest recorded work of Buddle, and documents the early influence of Dave Dallwitz.
